Scope: The scope of Solicitation PU-2026-PPS-1551 is focused on providing comprehensive temporary staffing and workforce augmentation services to support Princeton University’s operational, administrative, and technical workforce needs across multiple departments and functional areas. The selected contractor(s) will be responsible for recruiting, screening, onboarding, and managing qualified temporary personnel for a wide range of labor categories, including administrative, clerical, accounting, finance, technical, and professional support positions. In addition to staffing services, the university is seeking vendors capable of delivering scalable workforce management solutions, including timekeeping, reporting, scheduling, and operational support systems that improve staffing efficiency and responsiveness. The scope emphasizes rapid staffing capability, access to large talent pools, consistent service delivery, and the ability to support evolving institutional workforce demands through flexible and technology-enabled staffing solutions.

2. Opportunity Summary

Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) is seeking proposals through an open enrollment Request for Proposal (RFP 213568821CK) for **professional coaching and development services to support executive coaching and leadership development for University personnel at all organizational levels**. VCU is located in Richmond City, with operations also extending to Roanoke City.

Proposals must be submitted electronically via Smartsheet by May 25, 2026 at 2:00 PM. The resulting Master Services Agreement will have an initial term from the effective date through September 30, 2027, with options to renew for two additional two-year periods extending through September 30, 2031, with anticipated award announcements on June 15, 2026.

VCU has established a small business and supplier diversity goal of 42 percent expenditures with Small Business and Supplier Diversity (SBSD) certified businesses and an aspirational 10 percent increase in local business spending; selected firms must identify and fairly consider SBSD-certified firms for subcontracting opportunities and submit quarterly SBSD business reports. Firms with active contracts from previous generations of this RFP are ineligible to submit proposals.

This is a **Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Atlantic 8(a)** set-aside IDIQ for professional support services, solicitation N6247026R0013, **proposal due June 4, 2026 at 2:00 PM** via PIEE. **It is Firm Fixed Price, with a total ordering ceiling of \$100M and task orders up to \$20M.** Base period starts 4/17/2027, with four option years through 4/16/2032.

Opportunity fit: *Strong for firms with NAVFAC/USACE, A-E support, construction management, cost estimating, planning, GIS, SharePoint/Power Platform, and engineering staffing experience. The PWS covers 44 labor categories and requires rapid onboarding within 30 days, mostly in Portsmouth, VA and Kittery, ME, with possible remote/other locations.*

Evaluation: Best-value tradeoff. Non-price factors are Corporate Experience, Safety, and Past Performance; non-price and price are approximately equal. Award may be made without discussions, so the initial proposal must be clean.
